### Our Goals for Student Achievement

#### **School Goals:**

LEAP 2025 math whole school % proficient score will increase from 30.3% (17 students) to 38 % (21 students)

LEAP 2025 math percent proficient for 3rd graders (48 students) will increase from 21% (10 students) proficient to 31% (15 students) proficient or above on LEAP2025 Spring 2022 assessment.

LEAP math proficient for 2021-2022 5th graders (56 students) will increase from 30% (17students) to 36% (21 students).

LEAP 2025 data will show an increase in the math sub-claim of major content from 33% (47 students) proficient to 36% (51 students) or above on the LEAP 2025 Spring 2022 assessment.

LEAP ELA whole school % proficient will increase from 30% (42 students) to 33% (47 students).
