

Additional Days of Observance

during the regular school year

➤ September 17 - Constitution Day

Constitution Day is an American federal holiday that recognizes the ratification of the US Constitution. It is observed on the day it was signed in 1787.

➤ November 29 - Nellie T. Ross' Birthday

To commemorate Nellie T. Ross, the 14th Governor of Wyoming and the first female governor in the history of the United States.

➤ December 7 - Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day

To commemorate the attack on Pearl Harbor, in Hawaii, during World War II.

➤ December 10 - Wyoming Day

To commemorate the first law in US history explicitly granting women the right to vote.

➤ May - Native American Day

The second Friday in May is designated as Native American Day in Wyoming in recognition of the North American Indian.

Optional Days of Remembrance

during the regular school year

➤ November - Election Day

Election Day occurs on the Tuesday following the first Monday of November.

➤ November 11 - Veteran's Day

To honor military veterans. It is the actual anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I.

➤ January – Martin Luther King Day/Wyoming Equality Day

A federal holiday, on the third Monday in January, to commemorate the life and achievements of Martin Luther King, Jr. In 1990, Wyoming passed a bill that established Martin Luther King Day/Wyoming Equality Day as a state holiday.

➤ February – Presidents' Day

A federal holiday, on the third Monday in February, officially George Washington's birthday. The day is sometimes understood as a celebration of the birthdays and lives of all U.S. presidents.
