

## Schools Parent and Family Engagement Policy Caney Public Schools

In support of strengthening student academic achievement, Caney Public Schools receives Title I, Part A funds and therefore must jointly develop with, agree on with, and distribute to parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement policy, agreed on by such parents, that shall describe the means of carrying out the requirements of The Every Students Succeeds Act (ESSA) Section 1116. Parents shall be notified of the policy in an understandable and uniform format and, to the extent practicable, provided in a language the parents can understand. Such policy shall be made available to the local community and updated periodically to meet the changing needs of the parents and the Schools. The policy establishes the School's expectations for parent and family engagement and describes how the Schools will implement a number of specific parental and family engagement activities.

Caney Public Schools understands that parent and family engagement means the participation of parents and families in regular, two-way, and meaningful communication involving student academic learning and other Schools activities, including ensuring:

- Parents and families play an integral role in assisting their child's learning
- Parents and families are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education at Schools
- Parents and families are full partners in their child's education and are included, as appropriate, in decision-making and on advisory committees to assist in the education of their child

Caney Public Schools agrees to implement the following requirements as outlined by ESSA Section 1116:

### **A. ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING**

Caney Public Schools will conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the School's Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents' requirements, the Schools parental involvement policy, the Schoolwide plan, and the School-parent compact.

### **B. JOINTLY DEVELOPED**

Caney Public Schools will involve parents in an organized, ongoing, and timely way, in the planning, review, and improvement of programs under Title I, Part A, including the planning, review, and improvement of the Schools parent and family engagement policy and the joint development of the Schoolwide program plan.

### **C. COMMUNICATION**

Caney Public Schools will provide parents of participating children timely information about programs under Title I, including:

- a) a description and explanation of the curriculum in use,
- b) forms of academic assessment used to measure student progress,
- c) achievement levels of the challenging State academic standards, and
- d) if requested by parents, opportunities for regular meetings to formulate suggestions and participate, as appropriate, in decisions relating to the education of their children and respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicable possible.

Information related to the School and parent programs, meetings, and other activities, will be sent to the parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand

### **D. DISSENSION PROCESS**

Caney Public Schools will submit any comments/concerns to the Caney Schools District Superintendent's office if the Schoolwide plan and/or parent and family engagement policy is not satisfactory to parents.

### **E. SCHOOLS-PARENT COMPACT**

Caney Public Schools will develop with parents of participating children a Schools-parent compact that outlines how families, Schools, staff, and students will share the responsibility for improved student academic achievement and develop a partnership to help children achieve the state's high standard and how the plan is used, reviewed, and updated.

### **F. BUILD CAPACITY OF PARENTS**

Caney Public Schools will build the parents' capacity for strong parental involvement to ensure effective involvement of parents and families and to support a partnership among the Schools and the community to improve student academic achievement through the following:

- Materials and training to help parents to work with their child to improve their child's achievement, such as literacy training and using technology (including education about the harms of copyright piracy), as appropriate, to foster parental involvement
- Provide assistance to parents of participating children, as appropriate, in understanding topics such as the following:

- the State's academic content standards,
- the State's student academic achievement standards,
- the State and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
- the requirements of Title I, Part A,
- how to monitor their child's progress, and
- how to work with educators to improve the achievement of their children.
- Educate School personnel, specialized instructional support personnel, principals, and other Schools leaders, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of the contributions of parents, and in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners, implement and coordinate parent programs, and build ties between parents and the Schools.
- Coordinate and integrate parental involvement programs and activities with other Federal, State, and local programs, including public preschool programs, and conduct other activities, such as parent resource centers, that encourage and support parents to fully participate in the education of their children.

#### **G. ACCESSIBILITY**

Caney Public Schools in carrying out the parent and family engagement requirements of this part, to the extent practicable, shall provide full opportunities, for the participation of parents and family members (including parents and family members with limited English proficiency, parents and family members with disabilities, and parents and family members of migratory children), including providing information and Schools reports required under section 1111 in a format, and to the extent practicable, in a language such parents understand.
