ESSER III Spending Plan

The ARP ESSER III Spending Plan is a three-year projected budget. The spending plan was developed to maintain student learning services, as well as implementing new student supports for identified learning loss. In order to continue to operate safely and consistently throughout the 2021-2022 school year, Ringling Public Schools ARP committee members identified the following strategies/items as needs to effectively facilitate and operate for in-person instruction.

ESSER III Project	Strategy/Item for Prevention & Mitigation
Replacement of traditional water fountains with bottle filling stations	Prevent and respond to COVID-19 by removing traditional water fountains and replacing them with bottle filling stations to limit/prevent cross contamination between students.
Route Bus	Plan for COVID-19 by using bus for social distancing.
Security Cameras	Respond to COVID-19 by purchasing additional cameras that will allow administrators to monitor increased areas within and around the school sites to ensure that health protocols are followed.
Building Improvements	Prepare for and respond to COVID-19 by replacing building roofs and other various developments to improve health and safety of facility.
Bathroom renovation and remodel including the installation of touchless toilet/sink upgrades – RES, RMS, & RHS Main Building Restrooms	Prevent and respond to COVID-19 by eliminating high touch areas in restrooms with touchless toilets and sinks.

<p>Purchase NWEA Benchmark Diagnostic Testing & Edgenuity/Pathblazer Software</p>	<p>Respond to COVID-19 by addressing learning loss through benchmark testing to accurately assess students' academic progress and assist educators in meeting students' academic needs.</p>
