- Response Levels for On-Site Instruction

As of 7/20/2020, the Harmony Grove School District will follow the executive order that was signed by the governor. The Face Coverings Executive Order will require every person in Arkansas to wear a face covering over the mouth and nose: 1) in all indoor environments where they are exposed to non-household members and distancing of 6 feet cannot be assured and 2) in all outdoor settings where there is exposure to non-household members, unless there exists ample space of 6 feet or more for social distance. The executive order provides exemptions for persons younger than 10 years of age.

**All 3rd-6th grade students will be required to wear a mask during times where social distancing of 6' isn't possible.. This includes any time outside of the classroom when social distancing cannot be maintained.

In the event of a larger outbreak of Covid-19, the school district has plans for the continued operation of school depending on the extent of the outbreak and the directions of the DESE and ADH.

Access to technology and the use of other tools will allow the school to continue the education of students even in the event students cannot return to the building.

The school will return to normal operations as soon as the situation permits, at that time, students previously allowed optional learning opportunities under this plan will have to return to normal school activities.

Students enrolled in Virtual Arkansas (grades 9-12) will not be allowed to drop out of those courses in the event the school returns to normal operations. Virtual Arkansas courses require a commitment of at least one semester.

Students enrolled in Virtual Arkansas courses will be required to return to campus as normal at the end of the pandemic emergency, but will remain enrolled in the VA course.

Students enrolled in concurrent courses at SAU Tech must follow the schedule and policies of SAU Tech regardless of the schedule or activities taking place on the HG campus.
