

The History of Magnet Cove Magnet Cove is a small, rural community located among the foothills of the Ouachita Mountains of Arkansas. Magnet Cove is known internationally because it is one of only three locations in the world with over sixty different minerals in its square mile area. Magnet Cove was named after the "magnetic" rock called lodestone that is found in the area. Magnet Cove School district was organized in 1930. One room schools that were taken into the larger district at various times were the Henry School of Cove Creek, the Gourneck School, The Butterfield School, the Cook Hill School, the Tigre School, the Jones Mill School, and the Meadowview School. The present elementary was completed in 1974.
